Client is referred to Clinic by case worker, service provider, or client directly contacts Clinic

Sign paperwork online. Meet with attorney on a phone call or Zoom call or in-person appointment Provide demographic data (name, address, gender, occupation, etc) and background on criminal charges.

1) Referral to Clinic

2) Onboarding and Intake

3) Petition Preparation

This can take anywhere from a few weeks to several months.

- Provide relevant facts about your charge(s). specifying how they are relating to your trafficking.
- narrative must show that the trafficking was the proximate cause of your charge(s).
- •includes gathering supporting documents to demonstrate your being a victim of trafficking (case reports, newspaper articles, text conversations, etc.)
- •you can write this out on your own and/or discuss with your attorney
- emotional/counseling support encouraged in this phase because of challenge in revisiting the trauma of your exploitation
- •finalize and sign off on Narrative, witnessed by a Certified Notary Public
- •Get fingerprints done by law enforcement on a physical print card
- •Ideally accompanied by a case worker, counselor, etc.
- Ask about alternative locations (Unviersity campus, etc.)


